



## **Indo-Canada Chamber of Commerce 2021 Awards**

### **Nomination form for Humanitarian of the Year**

Before filling the Nomination Form, please ensure you have reviewed the submission guidelines and terms, and the category descriptions.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR NOMINATION PROCESS.**

##### **Eligibility:**

Humanitarian of the Year award recognizes the accomplishments and contributions of an Indo-Canadian<sup>1</sup> philanthropist/social activist (<sup>1</sup> Indo-Canadian is a person of Indian descent and who is at present a Canadian citizen or a landed immigrant) who meets the following criteria:

- Indo-Canadian philanthropist/social activist/any person who has contributed substantial resources to a charitable cause/institution.
- Contributing significantly to alleviating human suffering and improving the quality of life of people in need anywhere in the world.
- Demonstrating significant leadership and outstanding humanitarian volunteer accomplishments that bring honor to the Indo-Canadian community
- Serves as an inspiration to others to emulate his / her example and contribute to other causes through volunteering resources.
- Impact on the lives of people with whom the nominee is working.
- Showing through the scope of work undertaken a commitment to humanity and selflessness regarding direct personal or organizational gain or profit.
- Establishing a legacy and/or sustainable program that is of ongoing value and benefit to others.
- Success in the getting broad based recognition to the organisation.
- Tangible contribution to the Indo-Canadian community and the Canadian society.
- A high profile in the Canadian and the global community.

##### **Submission Guidelines:**

##### **Specific to this Award**

##### **Submission of proof:**

- Residency – either Permanent Resident Status or Canadian citizenship status.
- Proof of significant Humanitarian contributions over a long period of time that resulted in measurable improvement to the lives of people (this may be anywhere in the world).
- Proof of impact: The degree to which the nominee's ideas have shaped the sphere of philanthropy / charity / volunteerism.
- Proof of service to the Indo-Canadian community – the quality and quantity of service must be illustrated through examples.

##### **General to all open categories:**

- In any given year, a nominee may be nominated in one category only

- Previous recipients are not eligible to be re-nominated in the same category
- Nomination from previous two years will be considered along with current year's nominations, only if it is agreed to by the nominee and current and updated information is re-submitted
- The attached Nomination Form must be complete in all parts; with signatures of both the Nominator and the Nominee (forms without signatures are ineligible).
- Written submissions, including initial narrative and exhibits, should not exceed 50 pages.
- A detailed bio along with a summary of the background and history of the business, professional, and/or other activities must be included as attachments with the written submission.
- Provide specific and factual information, where possible with concrete examples of what was done, how it was done, what benefits, or results were realized.
- Supporting materials must be current and attached to or included with the form.
- While written submissions are allowed, electronic submissions are preferred (CD or USB stick; please do not send large data files via e-mail).
- Completed Forms should reach ICCC through e-mail ([iccc@iccconline.org](mailto:iccc@iccconline.org)) on or before the submission date: 16 July 2021 by 5:00 PM.

**Evaluation process:**

- The Advisory Board of ICCC, an independent body of the Chamber, evaluates and selects the award recipient from the nominees.
- ICCC may engage an independent third-party to assist the Chamber and its advisory board to assist with the formal vetting and evaluation of nominations. You consent to the collection and use of your personal information by the Chamber and/ or its agent(s) for the purpose of assessing nominees' candidacy.
- The Advisory Board on behalf of ICCC may seek additional information from the nominator and / or the nominee during the evaluation process.
- Your nomination in no way obligates the Chamber to give the award to an eligible Nominee. The overall odds of winning the Award depend on the number and quality of nominations received.
- ICCC reserves the right to judge void any entry that the Chamber, in its sole and absolute discretion, determines do not meet these Terms and Conditions. Once submitted, you may not modify your Nomination Form.

**Privacy:**

By submitting a Nomination Form, you hereby consent to the Chamber collecting and using your personal information and to receiving commercial electronic messages from ICCC for the purpose of administering this Award.

**Warranties, Representations and Licences:**

All materials submitted become the property of the Chamber and will not be returned to the nominator and/ or the nominee. You hereby represent and warrant that the information you have provided in the Nomination Form is true, complete and correct to the best of your knowledge.

**Announcement of Winners:**

The Indo Canada Chamber of Commerce, at its sole discretion, will determine the Award winner per Nomination Category, from among the Eligible Nominees. The Chamber may, at its sole discretion, profile the confirmed winner in print, video, digital, electronic, mobile and social media formats of the Chamber. Winners will be announced and awarded at the Chamber’s Annual Gala.

**General:**

ICCC in its sole and absolute discretion, reserves the right to alter or waive any program condition including eligibility and criteria for selection prospectively and retroactively, or to withdraw, modify or terminate the Award, at any time, and reject any and all applications in accordance with the Award Process, without individual notice, and for any reason.
